Hard Work Equals Value By Clyde Majerus

Getting your children involved in the garden will help them learn the value of working and of doing it together. Have them help you select future groceries from a mail-order catalog or at the seed store. Get them involved as you prepare the garden bed, plant the seeds, fertilize and mulch, and do the weeding and watering. Teach them to use tools: rake, shovel, string line and compass, plus the fun tools the garden hose and sprinkler.

As the fruit comes on, they can assist with harvesting and preparing for the dinner table. Let them help while you can veggies or freeze them for storage until the winter months. No doubt your children will learn how to work as they observe your diligence. And it won't be long until they have a much better understanding of what it takes to keep a family fed!
